WHY HAVE AN ALE TRAIL?

The idea for the **Burton Ale Trail** first came about shortly after the 2020 Burton & South Derbyshire CAMRA Beer Festival was cancelled at the eleventh hour. In such uncertain times it was foolhardy to even think about organising another event of that magnitude, so the idea of something that could be put together quickly, with minimal risk and that would temporarily fill the gap left by the annual Town Hall festival was attractive.

In July 2020 an event to be called Going Down The Pub was provisionally arranged to be held simultaneously in a number of pubs, however with table booking and other such restrictions in place it was proving hard to get some of the pubs on board. Then came another Lockdown and the idea was shelved until better times ... fast forward to June 2021 and the promise of Freedom Day; a number of local pubs were contacted and arrangements were made so that as soon as the date for Freedom Day was confirmed the **Burton Ale Trail** was born.

Things then went crazy; the Facebook group was inundated with support as word began to spread, at the time of writing it stands at 2,300 members. There was an obvious interest and excitement for the **Burton Ale Trail**, after the long and dark days of Lockdown here was something to look forward to.

For a town of its size Burton upon Trent has a vibrant real ale / pub scene. Among the venues on the **Burton Ale Trail** there are a number of Micropubs who are free houses serving a vast range of different beers; you will also find tied houses for Joules, Black Country Ales, Fownes, Muirhouse, Burton Bridge, Marston's and Burton Town Brewery. The Brewery Tap sell Heritage Brewery Company beers and The Roebuck Inn is the unofficial tap for Gates Burton Brewery. You will be spoiled for choice, that's a promise!

This programme features profiles of all fourteen venues, a map so you can plot your route, a list of entertainment / events and beer lists (please note that unlike a traditional Beer Festival you won't find every beer on sale all the time).

It is hoped that this event will encourage people back into the pubs, especially those who ve been reluctant to return so far. With fourteen venues over four days overcrowding shouldn't be an issue but hopefully the weather will be kind and everywhere will be nicely busy.

Please enjoy the **Burton Ale Trail**, go and discover places you may not have tried before drink some excellent beers, listen to live music, have a brewery tour, go and watch beer being brewed ... in short have an fantastic weekend of socialising with your friends, be safe, drink responsibly and just enjoy being normal once again.
